



Further Education Courses SCQF Level 3-7

Nationals, Highers, Skills for Work & PDAs
National Certificate (NC)
National Progression Award (NPA)
UAL 1, 2 & 3 Diplomas
UAL Foundation Diploma

These qualifications are a great starting point for anyone who is looking to start building their knowledge within their chosen subject area.

Courses at this level will usually take place over two semesters of the academic year. They are considered as a great stepping stone to higher education and can help you to gain the core skills required to be workplace ready.

Higher Education Courses SCQF Level 7-8

Higher National Certificate (HNC)
Higher National Diploma (HND)

You will study an HNC for one academic year. This is usually considered as the equivalent of studying the first year of a university degree, with an HND lasting two years and considered as your first two years of university study. Once you have completed your course at this level, you have the flexibility of using your new qualification to gain employment or enter university in either second or third year.

Degrees SCQF Level 7+

Bachelor Degrees

Once you have completed your foundation qualifications, areas in which you can then progress to degree level at Edinburgh College are:

Associate Degrees SCQF Level 7+ Bachelor Degree University Route

These courses are agreed between the College and selected universities that guarantee* students direct continuation of studies to degree level or beyond.

The advantages of these courses are that you complete your first or second year of your degree at college and then progress to the selected university to complete your degree.

Studying to Suit You

Still at School?

If you are still at school then you can study part-time at college as one of your column choices with a Schools College Partnership (SCP) course or a Foundation Apprenticeship (FAs).

Schools College Partnership (SCP)

You can study an SCP course at college a couple of afternoons a week (typically). Studying at college gives you additional skills and experience to boost your CV, college or university application and employment after leaving school.

Foundation Apprenticeships (FAs)

These courses combine study with real-life work experience with S5/S6 pupils studying as one of their column choices at SCQF level 6. See more on page 28.

Leaving School?

Whatever level of studying you are at, Edinburgh College has a range of courses designed to get you ready for the world of work.

Full-time Courses

Full-time study generally requires you to attend college for 3.5 days per week (approximately 20 hours) with some variations.

Pre-apprenticeship Courses

These are college courses that help you to build skills and prepare you to apply for a Modern Apprenticeship.

Modern Apprenticeships (MAs)

Edinburgh College is approved by Skills Development Scotland (SDS) to offer Modern Apprenticeships where students study on a block release basis with college tutorials alongside paid employment. Please contact your employer for more details. See more on page 28.

Routes into Education or Employment

These courses aim to help you make the jump from school to college. You will develop your confidence and independence in a supported environment, gain skills and qualifications to move onto another college course, or to enter employment. See more on page 18.

Returning to Education?

College is for everyone with a wide selection of courses designed to help you reach your goal, whether its employment, further study or university.

Part-time and Evening Classes

Part-time courses are offered as day or evening courses to fit around your lifestyle. Attendance is generally 1-2 sessions per week depending on the type of course you are studying.

Scottish Wider Access Programme (SWAP)

SWAP courses are designed for students who have been out of education for more than three years and will provide you with skills to prepare for university study.

Open Learning

Open Learning courses provide flexibility for you to study in your own time and at your own pace, from home or at one of our campuses, using our Virtual Learning Environment, Moodle.

Looking for a Promotion?

There are a range of courses that are specially designed for those in employment that can give you the essential qualifications needed in the workplace to develop knowledge in your sector.

Day Release and Block Release

You can study work-based qualifications including Scottish Vocational Qualifications (SVQs), Professional Development Awards (PDAs) and Modern Apprenticeship (MA) programmes on a block release or day release basis, combining work and college study.

Professional Qualifications

You can study professional qualifications part-time, in the evening or via short (1 or 2 day) courses. We are accredited to deliver professional qualifications for your career including Association of Accounting Technicians (AAT), Chartered Institute of Personnel and Development (CIPD), Chartered Management Institute (CMI) and Chartered Institute of Marketing (CIM).



ESOL (College Based)

We offer English courses for speakers of other languages (ESOL). ESOL courses are full time, part-time or in the evening. Our classes cover all levels from beginners to SCQF Level 6.

Students study language skills, employability and citizenship, to provide the skills for life and work in Scotland. Students can study for Scottish Qualification Authority (SQA) ESOL qualifications, or for other language tests, such as IELTS and Cambridge certificates.

Teacher Training courses (TESOL) are also available for anyone wanting to start to develop their career in teaching English to speakers for other languages.

ESOL (Community Based)

If your first language is not English you can study ESOL courses with us. We teach language skills to live, work and study in the UK. Classes take place all around the city in community-based venues.

The School of Modern Languages


Learning a modern language will prepare you for further academic study, as well as exciting professional opportunities in tourism, international business, government and teaching.

At Edinburgh College, you can study French, Spanish, Italian, German and British Sign Language (BSL). Our courses offer the opportunity to study these languages at various levels from SCQF Level 5 to SCQF Level 7.

We also offer international qualifications (Spanish DELE).

You can study languages from beginner level on our full-time SWAP Access to Languages programmes in order to gain entry to university degrees in a range of subjects.

Many of our courses are delivered online or in a blended model for greater flexibility.

Whether you are looking to go straight into employment, join a Modern Apprenticeship (MA), or progress to college or university, a Foundation Apprenticeship can set you apart from your classmates.

Designed for any age from school leaver onwards, a Modern Apprenticeship can give you real-life skills for work by combining paid employment, college training and an industry recognised qualification.

You must be employed to start a Modern Apprenticeship as your college training gives you the knowledge and qualifications to develop further in your workplace.

Pathways to University

Higher Education (HE) courses don't always have to be studied at a university. You can start your degree at college, or in some cases while you are still at school. Colleges offer many of the subject areas you would expect from a university, and also offer full honours degrees in a number of areas.

Colleges also offer a wide range of practical, vocational courses, such as Higher National Diplomas (HNDs) and Associate Student Degrees. These courses are mainly run in partnership with a university, and can enable students to progress to university with entry at year 2 or 3.

College provides a very high level of teaching and learning support for students on higher education programmes and provides a more nurturing study environment.

There are many benefits to studying your course at college, including:

- smaller class sizes
- flexible study options, including part-time
- more class contact hours and individual study support
- progression pathways to degree courses

If you are planning to study at university, it can be a good idea to consider college as a pathway. One or two years studying at college can help prepare you to succeed at university and you will also learn the practical hands-on skills employers are looking for.

Learning Support Process

If you have a disability or additional support need, please get in touch with the learning support team at learning.support@edinburghcollege.ac.uk after you have accepted your course offer. Find out more about the learning support process below.

1.

Include your disability or additional support need on your course application. Examples:

- Autistic Spectrum Condition (ASC)
- A specific learning difficulty (SpLD) such as dyslexia, dyspraxia, dyscalculia or ADHD
- Physical impairment or mobility issues
- Visual or hearing impairment
- A mental health condition such as depression, schizophrenia or anxiety disorder
- A long-standing illness or health condition
- A specific learning difficulty such as Down's syndrome

2.

You will be asked to share your additional support needs records or we can provide advice and support with gathering this. Examples:

- Letters from your school/health professional/GP etc. which confirm your additional support need
- Certificates
- Dyslexia screening report
- Educational psychologist report

3.

Our Learning Support team will contact you to arrange a meeting using your preferred communication method.

4.

Your learning support adviser will support you in accessing reasonable adjustments across teaching, learning and assessment. They will work with you to agree a personal learning support plan, and help communicate your needs, along with recommendations of reasonable adjustments across teaching, learning and assessment, to those directly involved in your college experience, such as lecturers and learning development tutors.

5.

The Learning Support team will help you throughout your time at college by providing you with a main point of contact across the academic year for everything relating to reasonable adjustment recommendations and support requirements.

English Language Support

If English is not your first language, you may want some extra support. The English Language Support team will:

- Assess your language level before you start your course (referrals for testing will be made by your subject team)
- Help you plan and prepare for oral and written assignments
- Offer ways of improving your English, for example, spelling, pronunciation, grammar and using specialist vocabulary all within the context of English for Academic Purposes
- Improve time management study and referencing skills and other essential independent learning strategies
- Provide curated English language self-access websites to practice in your own time

Core Skills

Your college course will develop your specific subject knowledge. In addition, we will equip you with other vital skills to ensure you have the best opportunities after you leave us.

How to Apply

1. Browse Our Courses

Find the course that's right for you. Make sure you meet the entry requirements.

If a course is closed then you will have the opportunity to register your interest so you can receive email updates. If you want to find out if a course is the right one for you, check the website for open events to meet with teaching staff.

2. Apply Online

Press the "Apply Now" button on the course page to begin your application. If you have not applied before you will need to register your details and set up your account. You can save your application and return to it at a later date if you do not manage to complete.

Remember courses can fill up quickly so please apply as soon as possible for your best chance of securing a place.

3. Course Offer or Interview Offer

You will receive emails regarding the status of your application from application submission to a course place offer. Some courses require an interview, audition, assessment, or portfolio submission before an offer can be made.

There are two types of offer - unconditional or conditional:

- An unconditional offer means you have been accepted and are guaranteed a place on your course.
- A conditional offer means you must achieve further qualifications or meet certain criteria before you are accepted onto the course.

4. Accept Course Offer

If you are happy with your course offer, you should log into your college account set up when applying and accept your offer. This will secure your place on the course. If the offer is conditional, this place will be dependent on the outcome of your exam results.

If you are unsuccessful in securing a place, you will be considered for a suitable alternative course. You should apply for funding as soon as you receive a course offer (see page 46 for details). If you require learning support please contact us (see page 40 for details). If you have stated this on your application form we will contact you to discuss arrangements.

5. Enrolment

After you have accepted your course offer: You will receive your course start date and timetable via email. You will be sent a link to enrol for your course online. You will receive an EC Welcome induction to introduce you to your studies.

6. Begin Studies

You have made it! Time to focus on your studies and achieve your career goals.

New Applicants

You can only apply for one full-time course or up to three part-time courses per academic year. If you are unsuccessful with your course application, our Course Information team will contact you to find an appropriate alternative option for you.

Current Students

Funding & Fees

When you are thinking about starting college, one of the most important things to consider is funding and how you intend to pay for some of the costs that come with being a student.

You will need to consider two things:

- How you will pay for your tuition fees (course cost)
- How you will pay for your other living costs including travel, food, and accommodation

Funding Options

There are several funding options based on the type of course you are studying at college. These include:

- Bursary (full-time students only)
- Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA)
- Childcare Funding
- Discretionary Funding
- Care Experienced Bursary
- Student Awards Agency for Scotland (SAAS) (HE only)

Fees

To pay for your tuition fees, there are options available depending on the course you are studying. These include:

- Fee waiver
- Student Awards Agency for Scotland (SAAS) (HE only)
- Home or international tuition fees

For full information on tuition fees and whether or not you may be eligible, visit our website.

Applications for funding should be made as soon as possible. Applications are dealt with on a first-come-first-served basis. Applications for EMA, FE bursary and childcare funding are made via the College's online application system. HE students should apply to SAAS funding for HE bursary, HE fees and student loans through the SAAS website. Discretionary Fund applications open at the start of the course and are dealt with at Student Services, both on campus and via the virtual drop-in service.
