Over 700 courses are delivered across our four campuses based at Sighthill, Granton, Milton Road and Midlothian.

Schools College Partnership (SCP)

Our Schools College Partnership (SCP) offers a wide range of part-time college courses for S4-S6 pupils whilst still at school and provides greater choice in a variety of subjects which may not be available at school. SCP courses count as one of the column choices, which can be added into an existing timetable. Pupils come to college to study their SCP course two afternoons per week.

Doing a college course while at school will provide you with additional skills and qualifications to boost your employment prospects and enhance your CV, college or university application.

We work closely with universities and industry partners to inform and develop our curriculum to provide students with the best opportunities for employment or further study.

All SCP courses offer progression to full-time college courses. Our students study in industry approved facilities supported by industry experienced lecturers to ensure we also deliver the skills and knowledge employers expect from the future workforce.

College offers a different learning environment which will enable you to develop skills and knowledge and build your confidence to support transition to employment or university.

We are committed to ensuring all students are prepared for a successful future and you will find all you need at college to help you get good results and achieve your learning goals.



COLLEGE PATHWAYS TO UNIVERSITY

Higher Education (HE) courses don't always have to be studied at a university. You can start your degree pathway at college, or in some cases while you are still at school. College offers many of the subject areas you would expect from a university, and also delivers full honours degrees in a number of areas.

University Access with an HNC or HND Qualification

Higher National Certificates (HNCs) and Higher National Diplomas (HNDs) are work related or vocational Higher Education qualifications delivered at college. These qualifications are highly valued by employers and are accepted for advanced entry to many university degrees. University entry requirements vary so it is important that you check in advance.

HNCs and HNDs can also count towards membership of professional bodies and other employer organisations. You can apply for an HNC with 2 highers in a relevant subject and in some cases you can start your degree whilst you are still at school.

There are many benefits to studying your course at college, including:

- smaller class sizes
- flexible study options, including part-time
- more class contact hours and individual study support
- progression pathways to degree courses

If you are planning to study at university, it is a good idea to consider college as a pathway. One or two years studying at college can prepare you to succeed at university and you will also learn the practical hands-on skills employers are looking for.

Before you apply


When choosing a course, you should always discuss this with your Guidance Teacher or SDS Careers Advisor. This is so they can:

- Advise you whether it is the right course and level for you
- Discuss how it will fit in with your plans and other studies
- Help with the online application process and personal statement


Some courses may require you to participate in an assessment or complete a task as part of the application process and this will be notified in advance so you have time to prepare. If you receive any support for learning at school your Guidance Teacher will complete a transition form which will support your application and inform college of any additional support needs.

What happens next?

If you receive a conditional or unconditional offer you will be invited to attend college for a mandatory course information and induction session. Arrangements for you to attend will be made by your school.

LEARNING SUPPORT

Learning Support Process



Your school Guidance (or other) Teacher will include details of any disability or additional support needs on the College Tracker. This information will be shared with your college lecturer(s). Examples include:

Where required for external exams, your school Guidance (or other) Teacher will provide recommendations of adjustments that reflect the adjustments you access at school and provide evidence that is held such as:

- Letters
- Certificates

- Dyslexia screening report
- Educational psychologist report

A member of Edinburgh College's Learning Support Team, along with the campus School College Partnership (SCP) Coordinator, will collate the information provided by your school to create a personal learning support plan (PLSP) for use by external examination boards. Once you have signed this and any relevant paperwork, the information will be shared with your college teaching team.

UNDERSTANDING SENIORPHASE QUALIFICATIONS

Edinburgh College offers a range of industry accredited work-based learning qualifications across a wide variety of subjects which provide the skills employers are looking for. These qualifications are delivered at equivalent levels to Nationals and Highers and are recognised by employers. Work-based learning courses are assessment based and can be studied alongside other school subjects to develop a pathway to employment or further study.

Foundation Apprenticeships (FAs)

Foundation Apprenticeships are work-based qualifications lasting two years (or in some cases, one year). Pupils begin their Foundation Apprenticeship in S5 (and for some in S6). They will spend time out of school attending college and completing a work placement with a local employer. Foundation Apprenticeships are completed alongside other school subjects like National 5s and Highers. Completion of an FA leads to a qualification at SCQF level 6 (the same level as a traditional Higher) and allows progression to employment or training programs such as a Modern or Graduate Apprenticeship.

Foundation Apprenticeships are recognised as entry qualifications by all Scottish colleges and universities.

Higher National Certificates (HNCs) and Higher National Diplomas (HNDs)

Higher National Certificates (HNCs) and Higher National Diplomas (HNDs) are work related or vocational Higher Education qualifications. They are highly valued by employers and are accepted for entry to many university degrees.

Many universities will allow progression directly into year two or year three of a degree course on successful completion. This is known as 'progression with advanced standing'. HNCs and HNDs can also count towards membership of professional bodies and other employer organisations and can be used for entry to Graduate Apprenticeships.

National Progression Awards (NPAs)

National Progression Awards are industry approved work-based learning qualifications at National and Higher equivalent levels. They provide skills and knowledge in specialist vocational areas and are highly valued by employers. NPAs are assessment based and students are not required to sit a final exam.

Personal Development Awards (PDAs)

Personal Development Awards (PDAs) aim to help learners become more independent and to develop their potential as contributing members of their societies. Learners will develop self-reliance, self-esteem and confidence through supported and independent learning.

Skills for Work Awards (SFW)

Skills for Work courses focus on generic employability skills needed for success in the workplace. The courses offer learners opportunities to learn these skills through a variety of practical experiences that are linked to vocational areas. Skills for Work courses help young people to develop their self-confidence. They also aim to provide a very positive learning experience. A chance to work on practical skills that relate to the world of work provides real benefits to learners.

Vocational Training and Charitable Trust (VTCT)

The Vocational Training and Charitable Trust is the leading specialist awarding organisation in the UK for qualifications in Hairdressing and Beauty both within the UK and Internationally. All VTCT qualifications are mapped to UK regulatory frameworks and are recognised by international employers, governments and professional associations.



SCQF QUALIFICATIONS TABLE

The Scottish Credit & Qualifications Framework (SCQF) is a way of comparing Scottish qualifications. It covers achievements such as those from school, college, university, and many work-based qualifications. It does this by giving each qualification a level and a number of credit points. The level of a qualification shows how difficult the learning is. The credit points show how much learning is involved in achieving that qualification.

The SCQF helps you make sense of qualifications and plan the next stage of your learning journey. You can also compare vocational and more traditional qualifications and see that, although they are very different types of learning, in many cases they sit at the same SCQF Level.

Scottish qualifications are delivered at SCQF level 1-12. Course awards include National Progression Awards (NPAs), Skills for Work Awards (SfW) as well as National Certificates, (NCs) Higher National Certificates (HNCs) and Higher National Diplomas (HNDs).

FOUNDATION APPRENTICESHIPS AT COLLEGE - FAQS

What is a Foundation Apprenticeship?

Foundation Apprenticeships (FAs) are work-based qualifications for senior-phase secondary school pupils in industry sectors of key growth. It's a qualification that takes you out of the classroom and gets your foot in the door with an employer. You can choose a Foundation Apprenticeship as one of your subjects in S5 or S6, it's the same level of learning as a Higher (SCQF Level 6).

How does it work?

A Foundation Apprenticeship takes one or two years to complete (depending on your timetable). Pupils typically attend college two afternoons per week in year one and undertake an extended work placement with a local employer in year two. It is the responsibility of the College to organise work placements. You will be also involved in employability activities such as talks from employers, industry challenges, site visits, mock interviews and CV workshops! One year delivery option might be available for selected courses.

Who is the FA for?

Foundation Apprenticeships are designed for Senior Phase pupils who are capable of learning at Higher level, enjoy learning in a practical way and want to develop their skills, experience, and knowledge in a real work environment.

Is there an exam at the end of it?

No, there is no final exam at the end of the course. You are assessed on a unit by unit basis and will achieve the qualification by obtaining a pass in each unit assessment. You will complete a portfolio of work during your placement and you will have a workplace mentor to guide you. The portfolio will be marked by a workplace assessor provided by the college.

Why should I study an FA?

- Try out a career path while you are still at school
- Boost your CV or UCAS application with real industry experiences
- Develop transferable skills like leadership, teamwork, communication to enable you to better meet the demands of undergraduate study and the world of work
- Get a foot in the door with some of Scotland's biggest employers
- Make industry contacts and receive career guidance from an industry mentor
- Step into an exciting and growing industry that needs skilled people

Where could it take me?

- University all Scottish Universities recognise FAs as equivalent to SQA Higher.
- College FAs give you direct entry or count as entry criteria to HNC courses at all Scottish Colleges.
- Modern Apprenticeship (MA) you could progress on to a MA where you will be employed and paid to complete a Scottish Vocational Qualification (SVQ). As the FA includes SVQ units from the MA syllabus you will already have a head start.
- Graduate Apprenticeship (GA) you could progress on to a GA where your employer will pay for you to study for a degree.
- Direct Employment with your FA qualification and work experience you are more attractive to employers.

How do I apply?

If you're interested, talk to your Guidance Teacher or Career Adviser at school to discuss if this is the right route for you.

SCHOOLS COLLEGE PARTNERSHIP (SCP) FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Who can apply for these courses?

SCP courses are open to S4-S6 pupils. Places are limited and some courses will require you to participate in a selection process that includes an assessment or task to support your applications. You will also be required to attend a mandatory induction information session or transition event before your course starts. Your Guidance Teacher will be able to assist you with the application process.

You should:

- Be interested in the course and have the appropriate entry requirements
- Be prepared to participate fully in the course
- Adhere to the College Student Agreement

When will I attend College?

You will attend College alongside, and as an equally important part of, your school studies. Most of the courses run on a Tuesday and Thursday afternoon from 1.30pm till 4pm. Please check the college website for confirmation of days and times.

Regular attendance at College is vital to ensure you successfully complete your course and achieve your qualification. This information is shared with your School. You will be required to catch up with any work missed to due to absence.

What kind of support will I get when I'm at College?

The Schools Team is here to help and support you during your time at college to make sure that you are happy with your chosen course choice and on track to achieve your study goals. There is a Schools Co-ordinator on each campus and this person is your main point of contact when you are at college. It's important to attend your classes regularly and keep in touch to let us know if you have any problems or concerns during your time in college as we are here to help and support you to succeed.

If you receive support at school your Guidance Teacher will provide us with information to help with your transition to college.

How do I travel to College?

You will agree travel arrangements with your school, ensuring that you arrive on time for your College class. Please speak to your Guidance Teacher to discuss transport options.

How will I be assessed at College?

Assessments vary depending on the type of course you are studying. Most vocational training programmes are monitored by ongoing assessment of the subject areas covered by your course. Your Lecturer will identify key points throughout the year when assessment will take place.

Subjects which have SQA final exams will follow the normal SQA exam timetable. Dates and arrangements will be notified by your course lecturer.

How will I know how I am doing on the course?

Your lecturer will provide your school with regular reports on your progress throughout the year. You will also be able to get and update on your progress by speaking with your lecturer.

How will the course be certificated?

Qualifications gained through the Schools College Partnership Programme are structured and assessed in the same way as school qualifications and in most cases will appear on your SQA certificate in August, alongside your school subjects. Some courses are industry specific qualifications and will be certificated separately.
